**ORDER**

On August 2, 2010, plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") filed an amended complaint which, inter alia, added Nancy McGinn ("McGinn") as a defendant. Dkt. No. 100. On August 3, 2010, the application of the SEC was granted and an order was entered which, as to McGinn, temporarily restrained her assets and ordered her to show cause why a preliminary injunction granting the same relief should not be entered. Dkt. Nos. 103, 104. McGinn, proceeding pro se in this action, did not oppose the SEC's motion. On November 22, 2010, an order was entered granting the SEC's motion as to another defendant but leaving unresolved its motion as to McGinn. Dkt. No. 194. By letter dated December 21, 2010, the SEC pointed out the absence of any ruling as well as the absence of any opposition to its motion and requested a ruling. Dkt. No. 232.


WHEREFORE, for good cause shown and without opposition, it is hereby

**ORDERED** that the motion of the SEC for a preliminary injunction freezing the assets of defendant Nancy McGinn (Dkt. Nos. 103, 104) is **GRANTED** in its entirety; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the asset freeze in the August 3, 2010 Order to Show Cause is extended pending a final disposition of this action, including McGinn's Niskayuna property and all ill-gotten gains (including money, real or personal property, securities, commodities, or other property of any kind) of, held by, or under the direct or indirect control of McGinn.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**
