As you are aware, there is currently a discovery/status conference scheduled for Monday, January 31, 2011, at 9:30 am in your Chambers. I write to request that said conference be adjourned for a period of no less than two weeks for the following reasons: First, our firm has only recently been substituted as counsel for David Smith and we are still in the process of obtaining all the relevant documents and information from our predecessors at the Gusrae, Kaplan, Law Firm.
