Dear Judge Homer:

Plaintiff's response to the filing by relief defendant Lynn Smith and to the Order to Show Cause filed by the Intervenor, the Trustee of the David and Lynn Smith Irrevocable Trust, was due yesterday. I notified Mr. Featherstonhaugh by e-mail last night about 6:00 p.m. that I did not think plaintiff could meet the deadline. The reason is that plaintiff conducted depositions this past Tuesday and Thursday of the former trustee and of the relief defendant, and these depositions and the accompanying exhibits are highly relevant to the pending preliminary injunction motion. Although the transcripts were delivered within twenty-four hours, reviewing the transcripts and incorporating into our papers the new evidence that has emerged has proven time-consuming.

Plaintiff therefore respectfully requests that it be permitted to 4:00 p.m. today, June 3, 2010, to file its papers. We would of course consent in advance to any extensions needed by the other parties.
